

All the activities that Festival is well famed for will be there for all gentles to sample as they see fit.


As the Baronage we look forward to seeing as many guests as possible.

The booklet also contains helpful information about fires, cars, directions to site, alcohol rules, code of conduct for children and parents, and many other topics.

Site Rules

Please remember that the guiding principles of the Society are Chivalry and Courtesy to all. Camp Wombaroo is a private property, with the right to refuse entry without cause of any kind. Violation of the following rules may result in expulsion from the site without refund or result in a fine. You will be required to sign an agreement stating that you have read and understood these rules and will abide by them before entering the site.



General Rules

Please obey all directions from the Stewards, Constables and Marshals.

The token given to you at the gate must be carried at all times and shown at the gate for reentry.

Anyone coming on site must make an attempt at pre 17th Century historical costume at all times outside of their tent. As much as possible this rule should apply to all aspects of your camping as well.

Anything against the criminal code of NSW is prohibited at Festival. Do not bring illicit drugs of any kind.

Crossbows are illegal in NSW. Don't bring them.

Vandalism, graffiti or property damage of any kind is unacceptable. Police will be called to deal with such incidents. Anyone causing deliberate damage or vandalism will be prosecuted.

There are specific Fire Rules written in this document – you must follow them!

There are no animals allowed on-site – this includes horses unless by prior arrangement. Please let us know if you have a medical aid animal so that we can make arrangements.

Camp Site Rules

All guy ropes must be marked with white material/flags to avoid accidents.

Campsite areas must be kept clean – we are the SCA and we leave areas cleaner than we found them! Please follow the instructions of the Stewarding Team in regard to rubbish disposal.

Please pick up cigarette butts. They are untidy and a menace to wildlife. Dispose of them safely in bins or fireplaces.

No powerful electric light sources (e.g. Coleman lanterns) may be used outside or in public areas.

Chemical toilets are not to be emptied onsite.

No swimming after dusk (6pm).

The high ropes/climbing equipment is out of bounds.



Alcohol

No-one may sell alcoholic beverages without the proper license. Only the Tavern and The Wine Bar have the proper license.

Providing alcohol to minors is an offence. Do not do it or you will be asked to leave.



Children and Parents

The Rowany Festival rules for parental supervision have recently been reviewed and significant changes have been made in line with NSW legislation and guidelines, current best practice and the context in which the Rowany Festival operates.

Rowany Festival will adopt the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian guidelines, amended to suit the Rowany festival environment.

The most significant change parents need to be aware of are:

- You are always responsible for your child/ren and his/ her actions. To help parents understand the expected standard of behaviour, a Code of Conduct has been developed. You will need to take the time to read, understand and sign the Parental Supervision Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct will be available across SCA Lochac websites and FB pages and available to be signed at the Rowany Festival registration point.
- The requirements for parental supervision are age dependant. Please read the guidelines attached and be sure you are aware of the supervision levels required for your child/children.
- The guidelines mean that it is not the responsibility of the constables to ensure all children are under adult supervision at all times. Instead the constabulary will be required to intervene only when a very young child is unsupervised; a child is breaking the rules of festival, is in a prohibited area, is endangering themselves/ others or disturbing the peace.
- Children aged 7 and under will be required to wear a tag identifying who they are, their campsite and their parent/ caregiver
- The tavern and wine bar, is legally prohibited to unaccompanied minors. Children may attend tavern accompanied by a parent/carer, and must not be within one metre of the bar at any time. This includes to buy non-alcoholic drinks parents will need to obtain the non-alcoholic drinks for them. During the Market, the bar is closed and children may enter unaccompanied.
- Dams and waterways are prohibited areas to unaccompanied minors. Children under 14 years must be accompanied by a parent/carer.
- The equestrian area, archery field and war field are prohibited areas to unaccompanied minors. Children under 14 years must be accompanied by a parent/carer.
- The Steward has the authority to impose a range of sanctions or restrictions in response to behaviour that is dangerous, disruptive or against the Festival Rules, up to and including expulsion from Festival. Children are the responsibility of their parent or guardian. Children under 7 must be clearly identified with their name, campsite and adult responsible for them. A token for this will be available at the Sign In Tent. The parent or guardian of any child found without this identification will be warned once and then asked to leave if it occurs again.

The code of conduct for Parents and Children will be available on the website and at the gate, and parents must read it and sign it before entering site.

Media Rules

Any members of the media must make prior arrangements with the Festival Stewards. Any media persons arriving and hoping to report from Festival without having made prior arrangements will not be permitted on site.

The Fire Rules

No unattended open flames are permitted inside tents.

Campsites must be set back a minimum of 10 metres from areas of unmanaged bushland, with this area kept clear of obstructions at all times. This is to give a clear break between bushland and tents, and allow fire fighting vehicle access should it be necessary.

Should a Total Fire Ban be called, no ignition sources may be used outside buildings. If the Fire Danger Rating is Very High or above, Camp Wombaroo rules prohibit the use of open flames.

If the fire danger rating during Festival is Extreme or Catastrophic, Festival will be closed, and attendees already there will have to evacuate.



All fires and flame sources must be attended. If fires are found unattended, attendees may receive a fine of \$50 or more, and/or be requested to leave the event. This includes but is not limited to campfires, lanterns, candles, tiki torches and mosquito coils.

Camp-fires must be in a four (4) metre diameter cleared area, free from long grass, tents and overhanging trees. Fires must be contained either in a stone or brick surround, NOT in a pit. Camp Wombaroo has a number of designated camp fire areas – no new camp fire areas are to be established without permission from Camp Wombaroo staff.

All camp-sites must have a clear and adequate method for extinguishing their fire: a chemical fire extinguisher, multiple buckets of water or sand for each fire, or a fire blanket. If a camp site's fire precautions are not adequate a fine will be issued. Event staff will be monitoring fire safety throughout the event, particularly in the evenings.

Disposing of tobacco ashes must be in bins or in fire places.

All Local Fire Restrictions as set out by the Rural Fire Service must be adhered to.

Cooking safety – all gas stoves/bbqs/ovens/fires must have a means of extinguishing, eg a fire blanket, bucket of earth, and/or chemical fire extinguisher. Note that water should not be the sole means of extinguishing a kitchen fire.

Firewood can be foraged for, but no chain saws or electric powered cutting implements used. If the wood is on the ground it is fair game but if it isn't then don't take it. Firewood can also be purchased off site and brought onto site.

Car Rules

Motorised vehicles are only allowed to drive on site, using the marked roadways, at 5km/h until 8.30am on Friday morning. Between 5pm and 9 pm on Monday evening and 6 am to 8 am on Tuesday morning the following roads on the campsite may be used: Abbey Road (main gravel road to buildings), Appian Way (main road from gate onwards), Jarnrgata (past Mordenvale) and as far as the Northern Reaches on Via Stigma. Do not drive past the Village Green. After 5pm Tuesday, all roads in the campsite become available. At no other times will a motorised vehicle be allowed on-site, except for medical emergencies or amenities management. St John Ambulance will coordinate emergency medical access.

Car parking during the event will be in the designated carpark only. Take care when parking that you do not block other vehicles from leaving the carpark. Do not park in the spaces reserved for Royalty or the Steward, unless you are Royalty or the Steward.

Please adhere to the posted speed limits and drive on designated roads.

Loading zones provided near the sign-in tent are for short term parking only. You will be asked to move your vehicle if deemed necessary.



Getting There

Camp Wombaroo is located at 162 Black Spring Road, off Wombeyan Caves Road in High Range, NSW, adjacent to Jellore State Forest. High Range is about 15 minutes outside of Mittagong in the Southern Highlands.

From Sydney:

Travel south on the Hume Highway
Take the Mittagong/Bowral exit
Continue along the Old Hume Highway
Veer right through Mittagong as you follow the
signs to Wombeyan Caves
After 2 km turn right into Wombeyan Caves
Road

From Canberra / Goulburn:

Head north along the Hume Highway Take the Mittagong exit (Old Hume H'way) Turn left onto the Old Hume H'way After approximately 500 m, turn right into Wombeyan Caves Road

Once on Wombeyan Caves Road:


Travel down Wombeyan Caves Road for 12 km Turn right into Black Spring Road

After 1.5 km, veer right into the Camp Wombaroo property (signed)

Please observe a maximum speed of 40 km/h on Black Spring Road, and obey all signs and directions once at Camp Wombaroo. For the busiest days there will be people on duty directing traffic.

To get a specific location, search google maps for 162 Black Spring Rd, High Range, NSW.

DO NOT follow google maps and go down Soapy Flat Road as this is a four wheel drive only track, please follow the instructions above and go to Black Spring Road instead.



When You Arrive On Site

Once you have reached Camp Womberoo, follow the signs to the camping area. You must stop at the entry by the Gatekeeper's tent where if you have not already booked you will be required to register, read and sign the site rules and indemnity and be given your token.

When you arrive at Rowany Festival you will need to show proof of membership and indemnity at the gate. If you are unable to prove membership you will have to pay the non-member price. Please ensure you have your membership card handy to help prevent a back log at the gate. A clear photo of your card showing the date it expires and the date the indemnity expires is acceptable.

Your token is proof of payment; please carry it with you. There will be a map that indicates where campsites have been allocated, and the campsites will be signposted. If you have not booked a campsite, please speak to the gatekeepers and they will advise you of where you can camp.

Cabins and bunk rooms will not be available for booking at the gate; you must have already booked and confirmed a cabin or bunk bed if you need one.

Timetables, including for all activities and classes are available from the Gatehouse.

Please take care when driving on site, and keep your speed to a minimum. Although we will have no trouble with dust, we would like to keep the grass intact, so the site does not immediately become a muddy quagmire should it rain.

Campsites

The current draft of the Campsite Allocations is available from the Festival website. When reading the map, please note that all measurements are approximate only, and that the site plan will be updated based on confirmed booking numbers.

Booking prior to Festival will ensure that enough space is allocated to each campsite. If your campsite does not have sufficient space for non-booked people then they will be directed to an "overflow" camping area. If you have not booked you will be allocated a campsite at the Gate.



Please consult both the map at the gate and a member of the Steward Team before you begin setting up your campsite.

If your campsite is under or near trees, please look up and check for risk of falling branches when deciding where to place your tent.

We are not permitted to create permanent structures this Festival. We must restore the site to the condition in which it was before Festival, as far as is practicable.

There is an RV campsite near the carpark for people who wish to stay in their campervans.

Amenities

There is bore water available on site, which is fully potable, and is already plumbed into the main buildings, cabin groups, showers and toilets. A number of taps will be situated around the campsite areas, from which individual campsites may choose to run hoses.

There is a beautiful swimming dam on site. Please ensure any children swimming are accompanied by a responsible adult. There shall be no swimming after dusk (6pm).



Campsites will need to provide their own washing/showering facilities as the showers available in the dorms are connected to a waste-water system that only has capacity for the number of people staying in the cabins. All wastewater from food catering and greywater from showers in the camp sites must be disposed of in seep-away trenches. No greywater trenches within 40 metres of the dam.

Campers should use the portaloos as the sewage system cannot handle the number of campers we will have at Festival. Fortunately Festival will have plenty of portaloos, because you all booked instead of turning up at the gate so we knew how many portaloos to order... didn't you!

Power is limited, available in the main building structure, and the additional conference rooms. Some cabins also have a power point. Power is not available in the campsites. Do not bring extension cords in the hope of wiring up your campsite from mains. You may bring a generator if it is quiet.

A lost property collection point will be arranged at the officer's pavilion near the Tavern and St John's tent. If you find something that you believe is lost, please take it there.

Skips will be located at a central point for all rubbish and recycling from campsites. Please do not leave furniture, bedding, stoves or other such items in the skips at the end of Festival - if you brought it, please take it away. When you leave, make sure your campsite is litter free.

The SCA does have permanent storage at the Festival site in the form of shipping containers. If you would like to store items at the site please talk to the stewarding team.

Looking after the Portaloos

A few words on these very important facilities.

The Festival site is not equipped to deal with the numbers of people that attend Festival if we were using only the built-in facilities.

Hence, we hire portaloos to deal with the toilet requirements, and we ask people to bring their own shower facilities.

Please do not use the Wombaroo toilets or showers unless you are staying in the dorms, have a medical reason why you cannot use a camp shower or portaloo, have small children under 5, or are really busting to go and simply can't make it to the portaloos.

Some general advice about using portaloos:

- Keep the portaloos as clean and tidy as possible. If you make a mess clean it up. Nobody else wants to deal with it. There are no magic toilet gnomes to clean up after you. Drunkenness is not an excuse clean it up when you can. Cleaning equipment is available at the Officer's Tent next to the Tavern.
- Close the toilet lid after use. Portaloos are designed to vent with the toilet lid down if the lid is left raised, fumes and smell build up in the loo.
- No rubbish in the portaloo. Only bodily waste and toilet paper go into the portaloo everything else goes in the bin. Sanitary items such as pads and tampons should go into a sanitary waste bin (in the Wombaroo toilets), or be wrapped, placed in a sealed bag and placed in the bin provided. Nappies should also be wrapped, sealed and go into bins.
- If there is a problem, go to the Officer's Tent. If you can deal with it yourself (eg out of paper), then do so. Otherwise, inform a member of the Stewarding Team.
- If the portaloo is locked, don't force it, shake it, or break it. Portaloos get locked for a reason.
- Some campsites have hired their own portaloos. They are entitled to exclusive use of these portaloos respect their space.
- If you vandalise or damage a portaloo (or any other equipment), you will be liable for the cost of cleaning, repairs and possibly a fine or banishment.

Facilities Nearby

Shops are available in nearby Mittagong and surrounding towns, including fuel, accommodation, cafes, supermarkets, chemists, a medical centre and hardware. Be aware that Festival falls over public holidays, so some shops may not be open on all days.

The nearest 24 hour hospital and emergency centre is in Bowral.

Health, Safety & the Environment

During the daylight hours there will be a daytime Constable who can be contacted via radio by any member of the Stewarding team. At night-time there will be roaming Constable patrols to ensure everyone's safety and security. A roster will be available in the Officers pavilion noting who is the on-call Constable at the time and their (likely) location. Please respect the patrolling Constables should they ask you to do something, remembering that they are there to ensure everyone's safety.

If you have a medical condition that could affect you during Festival then please notify the Chirurgeonate on arrival and fill in a Confidential Medical Information form, and let someone within your encampment know of the form's whereabouts should it be required. Please get all pre-existing medical conditions checked before coming to Festival.

Please, for health and safety reasons, all attendees should:

- Drink plenty of fluids.
- Bring your Medicare card and any prescription medicine that you require.
- Avoid drinking alcohol to excess.
- Wash your hands! Hand sanitiser is available in all of the toilet facilities.
- If you have Diarrhoea or Gastroenteritis stay well away from food preparation and notify the Chirurgeonate.
- To avoid help avoid communicable diseases, fighters are encouraged to have their own water bottles and clearly marked with their name on them. Under no circumstances should water bottles or drinking vessels of any description be shared around.
- Make sure that all wounds and sores are treated immediately to avoid infection.
- Wear shoes, sunscreen and a hat.
- Take care when walking through the bushland. This is Australia be aware that there may be leeches, spiders, snakes and wombats.
- Do not cough, sneeze, smoke, or touch your nose, ears, and face over food being prepared. Keep all prepared food covered until ready for use.
- Avoid cross contamination do not allow raw meats such as poultry, pork, and fish to come in contact with cooked or ready to serve foods. Make sure all raw meats are thoroughly cooked, in particular chicken and pork.
- Keep uncooked meats as cool as possible (use an esky/chilly-bin), or better still, bring pre-cooked foods with you.
- If you have any specific medical needs, advise members of your campsite, or the Chirurgeonate.
- If you do need to go to hospital DO NOT TAKE KNIVES OR SWORDS with you, and take them off inebriated people who have to go, too. These items are dangerous, and hospital staff should not have to deal with people carrying them.

Please let the front gate know if you have mobility related issues - you will have access to the disabled toilet near the Great Hall. Disabled Portaloos will also be available for hire should individual campsites require them.

Emergency Evacuation Procedure

In the unlikely event of disaster, so that everyone can be removed off-site as quickly and safely as possible, an evacuation plan has been devised. Evacuation Controllers will be wearing high visibility vests. In the event that we need to evacuate the site the following procedure is to be followed:

- 1. An air horn will sound a series of three long blasts.
- 2. Immediately go to the Emergency Assembly Area.
- 3. Follow the instructions of the Evacuation Controllers.

* * *

- 4. If it is necessary to leave site, move in an orderly manner to the car park.
- 5. Once at the car park, give your name to one of the people wearing a high visibility vest.
- 6. Move to your car in an orderly manner.
- 7. Once in your vehicle, follow the directions of the person(s) wearing the high visibility vest to form a column.
- 8. Follow the pace car (hazard lights will be flashing) to the staging area at Black Springs Rd.

Do:

- Check out the path between your camp-site and the car park before the need for evacuation.
- Follow the directions of the stewarding staff and the evacuation coordinators in this instance the evacuation coordinator is the final arbiter.

Don't:

- Panic
- Try and pack up your entire camp-site it is more important to us that you are safe not your possessions.
- Try to re-enter the camp-site after reaching the car park.

Because of the limited access to the site, it is necessary to have this process in place. Therefore, your understanding and cooperation in this matter are appreciated.




Catastrophic or Extreme Fire Danger

Due to the environs of Festival, if the Fire Danger Rating for any day of Festival is predicted by the RFS to be either Extreme or Catastrophic at 4pm on the day before, then the event will be closed and attendees must evacuate to a place of safety either that night or before 9 am on the day of the fire danger. The Fire Danger rating will be checked daily at 4 pm by Camp Wombaroo staff and an announcement made by the stewarding team if this measure needs to be taken.

Peaceful Activities

Royal Courts add to the theatre of Festival, rewarding deserving individuals and also providing announcements about what is going on. Please ensure that at least one member of your campsite attends each court. The heralds also make announcements throughout the day, so listen out to their call. If you want the heralds to announce something, come to the Sign of the Lambtree stall on Merchant Row, and write it on the blackboard.

On Thursday night there will be a **War Procession** after opening court, where companies declare which side they will fight for in the war. Afterwards everyone is welcome to join in the party on the Village Green. **BYO picnic**.

Children's Boffer Tourney

The boffer tournament is scheduled for 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM on the Saturday.

In order to speed up the auction process we ask that participants and would be bidders turn up to the field at 9:45 so we may have the lists completed and the bidding commenced by 10:00. Payment must be made at the time of bidding.

Children under the age of 10 years will require a parent or guardian to be present for the duration of the auction and tournament (though a guardian may be responsible for more than one child). The guardian's name will be recorded in the lists against the names of the children they are responsible for. For parents / guardians of children under six, we ask that you to closely attend to your children's matches and be on hand to assist with instructions if necessary. Cheers, reassurance and advice such as 'go on, hit them' are all encouraged.

Parents / guardians please bring water for your younger children and encourage your older children to bring a water bottle. Be sun smart and wear sunscreen and hats.

All boffers will be inspected as children are signed up to the lists.

We will take a common sense approach to this inspection but reserve the right to refuse boffers we feel are unsafe / under padded etc.

Please ensure that your children understand that the head is NOT a target in boffer combat. Children striking other children in the head will forfeit that fight. Repeated infractions of this basic rule will result in children being removed from the tournament (which is something we'd like very much to avoid).

Blows to the body will count as a kill while blows to limbs will result in the loss of that limb (as per heavy combat and rapier).

Children will be encouraged to call their own shots but Marshals will, gently and sympathetically, enforce blow taking.

If you have any prizes you would like to donate, you can drop them off at the Lemming camp or bring them to the tournament (putting your name on a piece of paper and somehow attaching it to your prize will allow us all to recognize your generosity).

Thanks for reading this and we hope to see many of your children on the field.

The tradition of The Boar's Head Inn



Combat Activities

Important Stuff for All Fighters at Festival

1. For all fighters: BRING YOUR AUTHORISATION CARD (or authorisation paperwork)! A photo of your card or paperwork, even both sides, is NOT acceptable proof of authorisation at this time. Neither is somebody



vouching for you! So you must have your card, or a full signed copy of your authorisation paperwork which is in date (3 months from the time you authorised).

- 2. Armour inspections will be carried out at a central inspection point near the village green. A HELMS OFF INSPECTION OF WELDS, PADDING, AND SPACING will be conducted, so check yours early. Also, new straps and fresh tape means a trouble-free fighting time. Heavies should particularly check thrusting tips to ensure they will not compress the wrong way and slide through bars.
- 3. Bring mesh if you want to fight war.
- 4. Plumed combatants make sure your plumes meet specifications.
- 5. Combat Archers ensure that your armour and weapons are up to date and meet current standards. Please check in the Lochac Fighters Handbook for what these are. This includes names and groups on all arrows.



Target Archery

Target archery at the archery butts this year includes the Inter-Kingdom Archery Competition (IKAC), a Queen's Round, a King's Round and a Clout Shoot. There is also a Kids Easter Choc Bunny Shoot, after the Kid's Fort Battle, and a Bear Hunt.

Please note that you may only shoot when there is a Target Archery Marshal present who is running the line.

Rapier

Welcome to rapier combat at Rowany Festival, we present a full schedule of rapier activities for your entertainment. As well as your favourite rapier activities we also have some new items to surprise and delight you.

This year as rapier comes of age we are pleased to have a pavilion beside the rapier field for all rapier combatants. This is where you will find a noticeboard of rapier activities and a place to meet up



with other fencers when not on the field. Every night from 8pm the pavilion will host a rapier social supper, a time for us to share stories and discuss rapier ideas. Bring your favourite beverages and perhaps some tasty items for supper to share. To help you meet new friends and kill them we will have the Festival rapier dance card, choose your partners wisely.

First, the serious stuff...

Rapier combat and Cut & Thrust combat at Rowany Festival are conducted in accordance with the Rapier Combat Rules for the Kingdom of Lochac. It is the responsibility of all combatants and marshals to be familiar with these rules.

You will be asked to register as a combatant and/or marshal before you begin fencing. This will require:

- 1. Showing an inspecting marshal your valid authorisation paperwork
- 2. Signing the combatants list at the Officers tent.

Please note you do NOT have to put on your gear and be inspected in order to register.

You must be inspected before taking the field for any sparring, tourneys, melee or Guild Prizes. This is the standard safety check to ensure that you have all of your armour on and that your weapons are safe.

Make sure all of your existing weapons, armour and masks are tested in accordance with the rules prior to festival. There will be limited inspection times at the rapier field for those who were not able to get testing done however testing will reduce your fun time so test before festival if possible.

Please note – the time stated in the timetable is the time the tournament STARTS. You need to be there, signed in with Lists, inspected and ready to compete at that time. If you are not on time for the tournament, you will not be permitted to enter!

Second, the Program...

Thursday the rapier field opens for free play.

There are many tourneys happening- something for everyone, if you are not able to participate in the combat we encourage you to support those playing.

Novice tourney- a chance for new fencers to test their fencing skills, open to combatants who have obtained their first combat authorisation since the last Festival and have never won a tourney.

Baronesses Tourney – Please the Baronesses of Lochac by your demonstration of skill and courtesy, remember to provide them with a delicious snack to enjoy whilst they view the fencing. The Baronesses will award the Blade of Chivalry to a worthy combatant.

Youth Tourney (new!): Open to our young fencers between 10-16 years of age, for those older watch the future of rapier in Lochac unfold.

Veterans Tourney (new!): for those of mature years (50+) an opportunity to display experience and cunning.

Cut & Thrust Tourney: The Cut & Thrust tourney is open to all authorised C&T combatants.

Queen's Glove of Courtesy Tourney: The Queen will award Her Glove to that combatant she judges the most courteous on the field. To be fought as a Token Tourney, offering all combatants at least six fights. After one hour, the 16 combatants with the most tokens will go to the finals.

Lochac Ladies Tourney: The Lochac rapier tourney for ladies only returns to delight.

Rapier teams' tourney brought to you by the Red Griffin company. You can fight, but can you fight together? The return of the teams tourney to Festival for teams of four.

Angels and Demons tourney: The forces of good and evil are once again at battle. The demons rising from the pits below, against the angels who seek to keep them from Heaven's Gate.

Rapier Auction Tourney: The last big competition of the weekend—fight for the honour and glory of your patron!

Melee games on the village green- fun with rapiers, better than running with scissors.

Guild Prizes: Several examinations are planned by the Royal Guild of Defence be inspired!

The inaugural rapier war (new!): make your own festival war story with rapier, bring your rubber band guns (RBGs) and rapier spears for rapier WAR!

Heavy Combat

The following heavy tournaments will run this Festival:

- Rose Tourney: The Rose Tourney is a tournament held to honour the Ladies of the Rose. The format will be Pairs King of the Hill. The Ladies of the Rose invite you to display your Virtue, Chivalry and Prowess.
- Henri's Pole Tourney: A tourney for pole-arm weapons only. Bring your glaives, spears, two-handed swords etc and have fun!
- Heraldic Melee Tourney: The premier heraldic team event of Festival form a team of no less than 6 fighters and no more than 10 (with a maximum of two knights per team), and compete in the melee for the highest prowess, most chivalric and best presented team.
- Barony of Origin Tourney: Fighters form teams according to where they first began fighting in the SCA, and compete in a melee to see where the best fighters come from!
- Penny's Shankin' Tournament- Hours of fun! Kill your enemies, then kill your friends!



- Fighter Auction Tourney (FAT): This year the tournament will start with several pools fighting round-robin tournaments on separate list fields. The fighters with the most wins will then enter a single-elimination tournament to select the final two combatants, who will then fight a best of three to decide the victor. Note that this year the Fighter Auction Tourney is on Tuesday.

Fighter Auction



At the auction, heavy and rapier combatants are auctioned off to the highest bidder. The winners of each auctioned fighter then have that combatant fight for them at the tournaments on Tuesday. Once the tournaments are complete, the "owners" can collect a prize from the prize table according the place their purchase fell in the tournament. **We welcome all donations of prizes.** The money raised from the fighter auction is held in trust by the Barony of Rowany for project grants that benefit future Rowany Festivals or the Kingdom at large.

- Importing expert fighter Sir Mari to teach armoured combat classes at Festival.

The tournament format will be a set of pools fought round robin simultaneously, with the top 4 or 5 fighters from each pool going into a single kill direct elimination. The final will be fought best of 3.

War

There are three half-days of war – Friday afternoon, Sunday morning and Monday morning.

The scenarios will be explained before each battle, so pay attention to the marshal.
